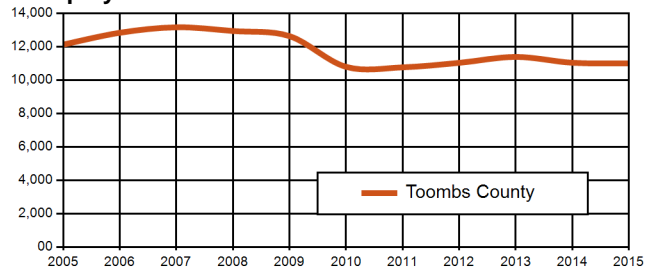

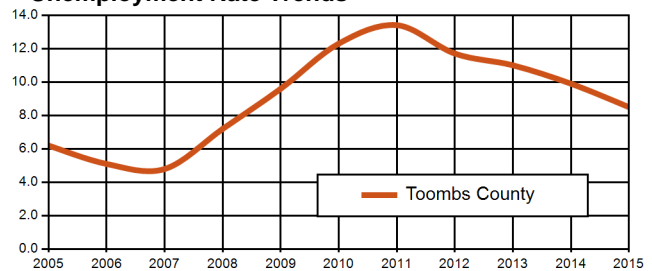

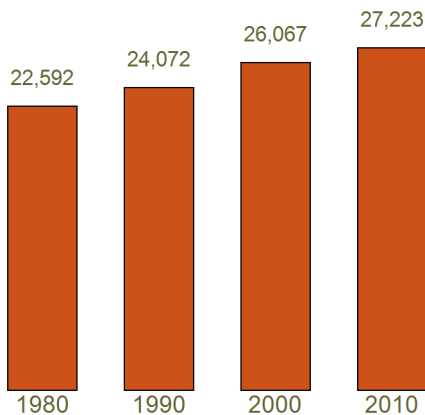
Employment Trends

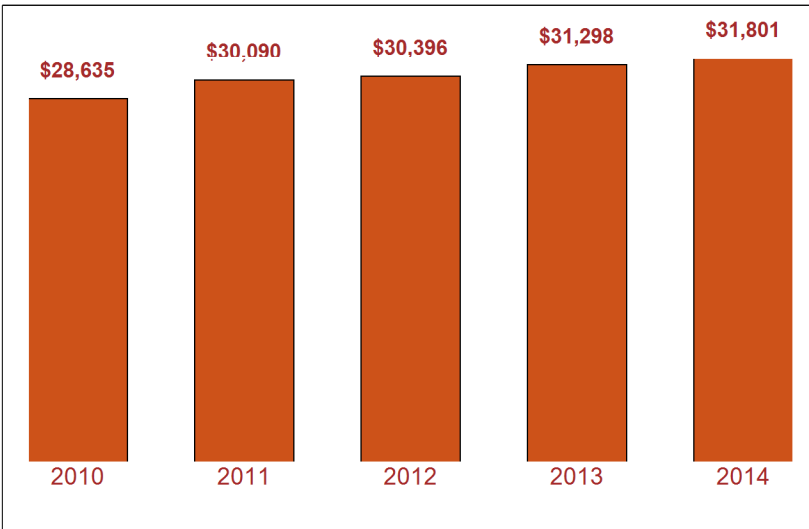

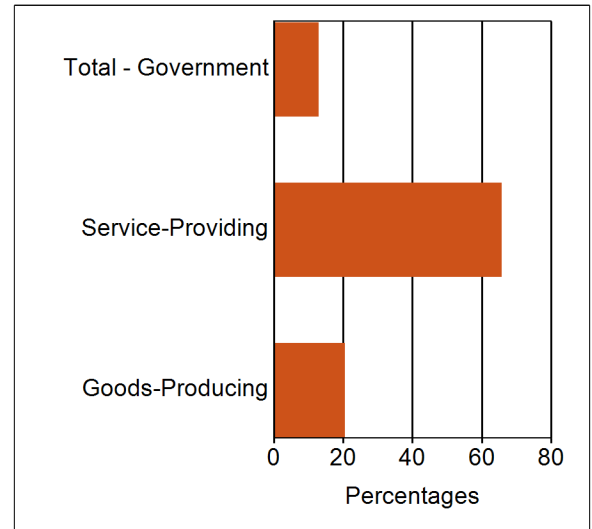
Toombs Per Capita Income
