Speakers included Helen Thomas, Special Needs Specialist at Southeastern Technical College, Senator Blake Tillery (19th District of Georgia), and Jeffrey Harden, Chief Nursing Officer at Memorial Health Meadows Hospital. After the ceremony, parents and participants enjoyed a meal in the student cafeteria.
